The funds we received from the city were used exclusively for services directly related to the safety of all attendees and participants at this year's event. This included renting meeting space to perform safety briefings for our volunteers which was co-hosted by MHPD, MHPD services at all events, and high risk road closure devices (water barricades) to ensure the safety of pedestrians. As an organization of one of the largest events in Morgan Hill we recognize that the safety of the community is our paramount concern and we greatly appreciate the support of the city in that critical goal.

Ref: City of Morgan Hill Community Funding Report FY23-24

Thank you for the privilege of serving Morgan Hill's children and families with vision, hearing, dental screening, wellness checks and the opportunity to connect them to follow up provider services in Santa Clara County. Healthier Kids Foundation's case management and referral network is what makes us unique from other screening programs—our goal is to ensure that no child falls through the cracks.

Your investment allowed the Healthier Kids Foundations (HKF) staff to serve children throughout 16 schools and 3 community events to support families in the following ways:

FY 23-24 Services

This school year, HKF provided hearing screenings for 2,789 children, 3% of which were identified with a potential unmet hearing need and recommended for follow up treatment. A total of 2,752 Morgan Hill children received a dental screening, 25% of which were identified as having one or more dental concerns and recommended to receive follow up treatment. A total of 2,860 Morgan Hill children received vision screening, 13% of which were identified as having a potential unmet vision need and recommended follow up treatment.

A total of 452 Morgan Hill 5th Graders received an emotional wellness screening; 36% of the children were identified with unmet mental health need and were supported through case management. 18 students received behavioral health services and 12 received basic needs support (i.e. food). Additionally, 14 children were enrolled into Medi-Cal. Our education programs served 74 class attendances in our 10 Steps for a Healthier You workshop series and 583 children and 8 adults attended the SmileFirst presentation.

In Morgan Hill, we supported 15 pregnant individuals who reviewed the following resources: 6 individuals received dental coordination services, with all obtaining dental treatment. 3 individuals were referred to 10 Steps for a Healthier You workshops. 8 individuals received a Dental Tool Kit and the PregnantFirst Dental Resource Page. 1 individual confirmed receiving regular dental care with no additional services needed.

We noticed that the dental referral rate dropped from 30% in fiscal year 22-23 to 25% in 2023-24. We also noticed a slight decrease from 17 to 15 individuals participating in the PregnantFirst program from the previous year. In addition, the Morgan Hill school sites were scheduled early in the school year when the SmileFirst staff had not been hired thus reducing the number of children receiving the dental hygiene curriculum presentation.

At Healthier Kids Foundation we look forward to continuing to support children and their families in the City of Morgan Hill.

Executive Summary

We'd like first to express our sincere gratitude to the City of Morgan Hill for having granted \$2000 from the City of Morgan Hill's community funding for IASC's Circle of Giving's Back to School drive 2023

On the 22nd of July, 2023 we conducted a Back to School drive in Morgan Hill at the El Toro Elementary school. 200 backpacks filled with school supplies were distributed to under-resourced families in Morgan Hill.

Background

IASCs Circle of Giving is the humanitarian initiative of the Indian Association of South Santa Clara County and is run by volunteers who care deeply about service in aid of our community. Circle of Giving is driven by its mission statement - standing together, serving our extended community - to provide services to those who are most in need.

Circle of Giving has had a significant impact on the community, and we're especially proud of the following achievements:

- 9000+ hot meals served through our Hands against Hunger program
- 500+ backpacks and school supplies shared through our Packed with Care program
- 1700 bags of groceries and care packages distributed through the Share the Care program

Back to School drive 2023

The Back to school drive is a part of the "Packed with Care program" that is focused on distributing backpacks & school supplies to those who are in need of these the most. The bags are filled with school supplies and care package items by volunteers in the Indian community.

The rest of this report focuses on the distribution drive at Morgan Hill, since the funds from the grant were used exclusively for the Morgan Hill event to serve residents of Morgan Hill.

The event was planned and executed in 4 distinct phases:

1. Pre-work and planning
2. Procurement of items
3. Identifying under resourced families
4. Distribution

Pre-work and planning

The core team of Circle of Giving got together and decided on the date, time and venue for the distribution. The following flyers were created and distributed

Specific roles and responsibilities were discussed and allocated to core team members.

Procurement of Items

Core team members took on the arduous task of comparing prices across different stores in the Bay Area. With high inflation, it was going to be a challenge to procure all the items we needed for the drive. At this point we were blessed to have the Indian community step up with donations of school supplies and care packages, while keeping costs under control.

Identifying under resourced families

We partnered with the community liaisons in the Morgan Hill Unified School district to ensure that families that were truly in need were recipients of these packages. The community liaisons reached out to 140 families who had students studying in various Morgan Hill schools via email and text.

Distribution

One day prior to the 22nd of July, tens of volunteers gathered at one of core members' garage to pack all the items and vehicles in preparation of the distribution.

When volunteers got there at 8:45am on the 22nd of July, there were cars already lined up. Thanks to our experience at running this event for the past few years, we had a well planned and orderly movement of vehicles through the school parking lot. Within an hour we had all the families that turned up driving away happy with new shiny backpacks filled with school supplies!

A few backpacks that were left over at the end of the event were passed over to our contacts in the school district who handed them out to those who couldn't make it to the event.

Expenses

The total expenses for the event are listed in the table below:

We spent \$1823.48 (\$176.52 less than the grant amount) on running our Back to School drive. Thanks to the generous contributions from the community. These donations of school supplies and care packages helped us come under budget, without having to reduce the number of families we were targeting through our back to school drive.

Once again, we would like to thank the City of Morgan Hill for their generous grant and are even motivated to continue serving families that need additional financial assistance in Morgan Hill.

The *Morgan Hill Open Studios (MHOS)* was created in collaboration with the *Morgan Hill Library Culture and Arts Commission (LCAC)* and the *City of Morgan Hill*, and operates as a project of the *El Toro Culture & Arts Committee* of the *Morgan Hill Community Foundation (MHCF)*. Right from our debut in 2021, we have been grateful for all the help and assistance from the *City of Morgan Hill*, the *Library, Culture and Arts Commission*, and *Morgan Hill Community Foundation*.

Services provided: On behalf of the *Morgan Hill Open Studios (MHOS)* community, we extend our heartfelt gratitude and thanks to the *City of Morgan Hill* for the generous community grant received through our parent organization '*Morgan Hill Community Foundation*,' and invaluable provision of venues free of cost for the 2023 MH Open Studios event. Additionally, we also thank the *Morgan Hill Library, Culture and Arts Commission (LCAC)* for the vital help and support from the LCAC commissioners who have supported and been part of the MHOS planning and working committee right from the formation of MHOS (2019). Special kudos to the LCAC commissioner who joined the Planning Commission and yet continued to be part of our committee. The crucial help from our parent organization *Morgan Hill Community Foundation* especially with the financial portion of the event (use of Formsite, Paypal and the MHCF 501c3) was another indispensable facet without which we would not be viable.

How funds were used: The \$1250 grant was put to effective use towards creating high-quality brochures, as we intended. These play a really significant role in our Open Studios event both tangible & intangible.

The 2000 beautiful, glossy, printed brochures served as an advertisement for our Open Studios event for over a month before the event, as well as a detailed reference for attendees about the participating artists, event venues, and our sponsors. It was placed in the Community & Cultural Center (CCC), Community & Recreational Center (CRC), Morgan Hill Library, BookSmart bookstore, as well as distributed among all our planning committee members and participating 37 artists to further distribute among their followers, family, and friends.

It also served as a memento of the event and was well received by the public. We hope it attracted business (retail & restaurants) in our city and added to city revenues.

Attached, you will find our financial records and a digital copy of our brochure. We would also love to drop off a copy in the city offices.

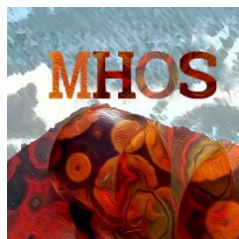

MEMO REGARDING PROOF OF EVENT PAYMENTS

The City of Morgan Hill apportioned funds for the MH Cultural Event celebrating "Fiesta Patrias, 16 de Septiembre", commemorating Mexico's Independence and celebrating the Democratic values which anchor many nations. The cultural celebration was held on Sunday, September 17, 2023, from 2:00-7:00 pm at Galvan Park.

The event was a family-oriented celebration, free of charge, and opened to the community at large. No alcohol was served or allowed on the premises. Various community groups were invited and set up tables to provide information and education re: health education, education re Medi-Cal enrollment, patients' rights, public General Assistance, emergency preparedness, and housing availability for very low income and low-income families. The City table provided information regarding the services it makes available to the community. Each organization was given time throughout the event to take the microphone to inform the people of the services being provided by their agency and to invite the participants to their table.

Among those agencies that set up tables were the City of Morgan Hill; Valley Health Plan; Gardener Health Services, Health Wellness Center; The Santa Clara County Health Department, COVID 19 Community Engagement TEAM; Community Health Partnership, Patients' Rights Team; and The Office of the District Attorney, Santa Clara County Youth Task Force.

We estimate the attendance to be over 350 people over the hours of the event, mostly families. It was great to see children using the playground in the park and youth playing pick-up soccer in the areas of the fields not used. The celebration went as planned and we are happy to report without a problem.

The payments made for the event are as follow:

The Sentinel Club and Grumasa received a 2023 grant to fund the event from the City of Morgan Hill in the amount of \$3,500. The City applied \$863 from the grant to pay the field rental fees and insurance. The City also charged a \$500 deposit however, that was reduced to \$00 since it credited the \$500 deposit using the deposit applied from the 2022 City Grant for the 2022 celebration, which had not been refunded. The Sentinel Club and Grumasa will just leave that 2022 deposit in place to be used as a rollover credit for the 2024 celebration event.

The City issued a check for \$2,637 for the event. The total expenditures for the event minus the \$863 field rental and insurance, amounted to \$2,800. Please see the attached receipts.

Again, the Sentinel Club and Grumasa will not request a return of the 2022 deposit that was applied as a credit for this 2023 celebration and instead will carry over the deposit to be applied as a credit for the 2024 celebration.

Chabad South Country Jewish Center Report on the Morgan Hill Chanukah Celebration 2023

On December 10th 2023, hundreds of South County residents gathered at the Downtown Morgan Hill Amphitheater to celebrate Hanukkah. The event was organized by the Chabad South County Jewish Center and featured live music, inflatables, traditional Hanukkah foods, ballon twisting, and menorah crafts for children. Attendees were also treated to a fire show performance.

The event was free and open to the entire community.

The highlight of the evening was the ceremonial lighting of a giant menorah, led by Morgan Hill Mayor Mark Turner who lit the middle flame.

The event was a great success and brought residents of the community together in the spirit of celebration and unity.

Summary:

Over 250 people from the Morgan Hill community attended our outdoor family Chanukah event. People of all ages, affiliations and walks of life joined together at the Morgan Hill Downtown Amphitheater to celebrate the holiday of Chanukah and its universal messages of freedom, tolerance and faith.

The City of Morgan Hill was recognized as a partner in related communications, on the event website, and on banners at the event.

The total cost of the event was \$10,000, of which \$2,500 was funded by the City of Morgan Hill.

2023 Holiday Lights Parade & Tree Lighting Summary

Sponsors: Morgan Hill Kiwanis and the City of Morgan Hill

Date & Location of the Event: Dec. 2, 2023 in Downtown Morgan Hill, starting at 4:30 PM ending at 7:30 PM with parade at 5:30 PM. The event required closing Monterey between Main & Dunne, Depot between Main and Dunne and associated side streets between Monterey and Depot.

Scope of the Event:

The scope of the event included all aspects associated with closing off downtown Morgan Hill and having a parade and the Holiday Tree Lighting. These included:

- Obtaining permits and working with the city and Morgan Hill PD to plan the event
- Hanging holiday decorations on 3rd street lamp posts (Snow Flakes)
- Notifying residents, newspapers and advertising the event
- Contracting traffic management company (D&M) to plan and execute road closures
- Contracting sound system company (Sound by Design) to provide parade and tree lighting PA system.
- Soliciting parade entries and collecting token fees
- Working with the city and MHPD to close off downtown and provide security services
- Staging the parade, providing trash barrel, staff to coordinate entrants and provide parade route crowd control.
- Coordinating with the Scouts (Troop 799 & 2799) to provide Santa, tree lighting and visits with Santa
- Post event clean up

MHPD estimate that at least 5000 people attended the parade and Tree Lighting with no major events.

Funding

MH Kiwanis requested \$14,500 to cover expenses associated with the Parade and Tree lighting. After reimbursement to the city and club expenses the unplanned for costs to MH Kiwanis is \$573.

Significant Issues and Observations

Depot and side street closures as well as traffic during parade staging and the event created issues for residents, Kiwanis team members and drivers. We will propose alternative staging for 2024.

Large number of people at the tree lighting overflowed onto Dunne, requiring MHPD to temporarily close Dunne at Monterey. For 2024, recommend closing the intersection to Dunne West bound traffic.
